HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE BACHELORS PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP

Triad's High School Graduate Bachelors Program Scholarship ("Scholarship" or "Scholarship Program") is awarded to selected applicant and applied towards the cost of tuition. The total amount of the Scholarship to be awarded ("Award") is ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), for education and training in a Triad Bachelor of Science program (excluding Bachelor Degree Completion programs). The Award is offered to a limited number of outstanding students who meet the criteria below. The Award is applied toward the cost of tuition and shall not cover payment of the following items: books, supplies, equipment, uniforms, computers, electronic devices, review courses or registry examinations.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants:

- Must submit the Scholarship Application;
- Must apply to a Triad Bachelor of Science program;
- Must have graduated high school within one (1) year at the time of application;
- Must meet all admissions criteria as listed in the current Triad Education catalog;
- Must have a minimum High School CGPA of 3.0. Sealed and signed transcripts are required;
- Must be a US citizen or eligible non-citizen and at least 17 years of age; and
- Must maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA to continue to receive the scholarship.
- Students may not receive this Scholarship in tandem with any other Triad Education issued Scholarship.

APPLICATION:

Eligible applicants must submit:

- A scholarship application; and
- Two letters of recommendation.

QUARTERLY DEADLINES:

The current scholarship application deadline is 5:00pm PST on the day before the start of the classes of the upcoming term to which the scholarship is applied.

AFFILIATE DISCOUNT POLICY AND APPLICATION FORM

Triad Education offer a 10% tuition discount to all medical imaging students currently employed by active medical and/or clinical affiliates.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants:

- Must provide a letter on affiliate letterhead that the student is an active employee of an affiliate;
- Must provide the two most recent paystubs that show an employment relationship between the applicant and the affiliate.
- Students may not receive this Discount in tandem with any other Triad Education issued Scholarship.
- Student must be enrolling in a medical imaging program

The current discount application deadline is 5:00pm PST on the day before the start of the classes of the upcoming term to which the scholarship is to be applied.

Vocational Nursing Student Opportunity Scholarship

The Vocational Nursing Student Opportunity Scholarship is awarded to selected applicants based on financial payment need and applied toward the cost of tuition. The total amount of the Scholarship to be awarded is **six thousand dollars (\$6,000)**, for education and training in the Vocational Nursing program. The Award is offered to a limited number of students who meet the criteria below:

- If Student receives a 3.0 GPA after completion of Term 1 of the Vocational Nursing program, Student will receive \$1,500 towards their Term 2 tuition.
- If Student maintains a cumulative 3.0 GPA after completion of Term 2 of the Vocational Nursing program, Student will receive \$1,500 towards their Term 3 tuition.
- If Student maintains a cumulative 3.0 GPA after completion of Term 3 of the Vocational Nursing program, Student will receive \$1,500 towards their Term 4 tuition.
- If Student maintains a cumulative 3.0 GPA after completion of Term 4 of the Vocational Nursing program, Student will receive \$1,500 towards their Term 5 tuition.

The Award is applied toward the cost of tuition and shall not cover payment of the following items: books, supplies, equipment, uniforms, computers, electronic devices, review courses or licensure examinations. By submitting an application, the applicant agrees that he/she has read, understands and accepts all the terms and conditions of this Scholarship.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants:

- Must submit the Scholarship Application;
- Must apply to the Vocational Nursing program at the Los Angeles or Ontario campus;
- Must meet all admissions criteria as listed in the current Triad catalog; and
- Must be a US citizen or eligible non-citizen and at least 17 years of age.
- Students with an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) number of 0 to 2500 are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Because this scholarship is based on financial payment, students are not eligible in any quarter they receive state based financial aid.
- Students receiving the CNA license scholarship or the Triad Affiliate Scholarship are not eligible. Students may not receive this Scholarship in tandem with any other Triad issued scholarship.

Deadline for Submission: The current scholarship application deadline is 5:00 p.m. PST, on the day before the start of classes for the upcoming term to which the scholarship is to be applied.

2022-2023 FOREIGN MEDICAL GRADUATE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP (FMG SCHOLARSHIP)

The FMG Scholarship is designed to give tuition assistance to foreign medical graduates seeking retraining in medical imaging. Awards are applied toward tuition costs only. Each individual award is \$5,000 in tuition.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants:

- Must be Foreign Medical Graduate enrolled in an imaging degree program at Triad Education;
- Must submit translated & evaluated transcripts from the foreign educational institution verifying proof of graduation;
- Must have applied for Federal Financial Aid for the current award year and determined to be ineligible for Federal Grants;
- Must have an EFC Range 5082-23000 (Based on the Federal Student Aid Report);
- Must be enrolled as a full-time student in an imaging degree program; and
- Must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 to continue receiving the award.
- Students may not receive this Scholarship in tandem with any other Triad Education issued Scholarship.

The current scholarship application deadline is 5:00pm PST on the day before the start of the classes of the upcoming term to which the scholarship is to be applied.

AMERICAN INDIAN SERVICES — SCHOLARSHIP FOR NATIVE AMERICANS

Qualified students may be awarded up to one half of tuition, from \$500 up to a maximum scholarship of \$2,000. Awards are based on financial need, academic status and funds available. Funding for awards is provided through charitable donations from independent donors.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- Show enrollment as a matriculated student in an accredited University, College, Junior College, or Technical school;
- Be at least one-Quarter (1/4) enrolled member of a Federally Recognized Native American
 Tribe, or descendant of an enrolled member, with possession of at least one-fourth
 degree Indian blood;
- Be working on their first undergraduate degree with no more than 150-semester or 210quarter credits at the time of application;
- Full-time or part-time status excluding non-credit courses (minimum of 6 credits);
- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 must be established and maintained after the first semester/quarter of college;
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

QUARTERLY DEADLINE: February 1, April 1, June 1, October 1

*NEW Academic Year Awards: We will now include awarding for the academic year. This means you will only need to apply once a year under Award III for the academic year, which typically covers Fall to Spring, or Fall to Summer, depending on your school calendar. You will not need to reapply for the individual terms once you apply for the academic year. Students will need to apply each term if they do not apply for the academic year.

AMVETS SCHOLARSHIP

There are three (3) specific scholarships available to Veterans, Active Duty, and/or Guard/Reserves:

- \$4,000 The AMVETS Scholarship
- \$12,000 Dr. Aurelio M. Caccomo Family Foundation Memorial Scholarship
- \$1,000 Henry G. Huestis Memorial Scholarship

There are two (2) specific to children/grandchildren of Veteran, Active Duty, Guard/Reserves who are currently High School seniors:

- \$4,000 AMVETS Scholarship
- \$1,000 JROTC Scholarship (must be in High School JROTC to apply)

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- Must be a United States Citizen;
- Must provide evidence of active duty status or venter status having served honorably;
- Must have a high school diploma or GED*;
- Must demonstrate financial need;
- Must be enrolled or accepted to an eligible program;
- Must not be in default on a federal student loan;
- Must not be convicted under state or federal law for sale of or possession of illegal drugs;
 and
- Must agree to authorize AMVETS to publicize your scholarship award if you are selected.
- * if in a senior year of high school, provide copies of most recent transcripts

ANNUAL DEADLINE: Scholarships reopen on or around January 15th and closes April 30th

ARIZONA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Arizona Community Foundation allows high school seniors and current college students throughout Arizona to apply for more than 100 scholarship awards online with one general application. Arizona Community Foundation is the state's largest provider of private scholarships. Over 100 Arizona students benefit from the group's financial aid efforts annually.

ELIGIBILITY

High school seniors, current college students, graduate students, or adult re-entry students attending accredited schools anywhere in the U.S. may apply

ANNUAL DEADLINE: The general application process begins in January each year and students are advised to apply early to qualify for the most awards. Deadlines vary for every scholarship, with many deadlines falling between March 1 and May 1. Scholarships are available for two-year and four-year colleges and universities as well as technical and vocational schools

ARIZONA PRIVATE SCHOOL ASSOCIATION LIFELONG LEARNING STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Lifelong Learning is a 501©(3) non-profit charitable organization dedicated to providing educational scholarships and career research primarily for Arizona Postsecondary Private Schools. All entries will be reviewed and the chosen scholarship winners will be notified to attend the APSA Annual Conference & Best Practice Conference to be awarded. The LifeLong Learning Scholarship is a \$500 award given to students currently enrolled at an APSA Member school or a recent graduate from an APSA Member school.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- Be currently attending or graduating from an APSA member school;
- Demonstrate outstanding career potential; and
- Show financial need or extraordinary person challenge(s)

ARIZONA SCHOLARSHIPS

ARIZONA EDUCATION AND TRAINING VOUCHER

The Arizona Education and Training Voucher (ETV) Program is a federally-funded, state-administered program which can provide youth who are or were in the US foster care with up to \$5,000 a year for qualified school-related expenses. Funding is limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis to eligible students.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- Be a current or former foster youth who was in US foster care on or after their 16th birthday, OR was adopted from US foster care with the adoption finalized after their 16th birthday;
- Be a U.S. citizen or qualified non-citizen;
- You must be a resident of Arizona;
- Have personal assets (bank account, car, home, etc.) cannot be over \$10,000;
- Has accessed ETV funding less than the 5 year limit (consecutive or intermittent); and
- Be in good standing and progressing towards earning a credential, so that applicants can remain eligible for funding until their 23rd birthday.

CALIFORNIA SCHOLARSHIPS

The following list is a sampling of scholarships available in the state of California (must apply directly to these organizations for consideration):

AAUW'S RE-ENTRY SCHOLARSHIP

The Women's Re-Entry Scholarship is awarded by the Poway-Peñsaquitos Branch of the American Association of University Women and is intended for a woman who is returning to a school of higher education to complete her education. Maximum Amount: \$2,000

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- Female high school graduate or GED without a bachelor's degree;
- Enrolled or accepted in a degree program at a community college, 4-year college or university;
- Currently taking courses toward stated goal;
- Engaged in leadership activity;
- Non-traditional student: at least 23 years of age and having experienced challenges in life and education that differ from traditional four-year path;
- Completion of at least 20 college-level credits excluding physical education and remedial classes;
- Lives or attends school in North San Diego County including northern city of San Diego.

CALIFORNIA SCHOLARSHIPS

CALIFORNIA CHAFEE SCHOLARSHIP FOR FOSTER YOUTH

If you are or were in foster care between the ages of 16 and 18 as a dependent or ward of the court and have financial need, you may qualify for up to \$5,000 a year for career and technical training or college. You don't have to pay this money back. You may also be able to use your grant to pay for child care, transportation and rent while you're in school. You can use your Chafee Grant at an eligible California college or university or career or technical school, as well as schools in other states.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- Be a current or former foster youth who was a dependent or ward of the court, living in foster care, between the ages of 16 and 18;
- Have been in Kin-GAP, a non-related legal guardianship or were adopted, are eligible only
 if the youth was a dependent or ward of the court, living in foster care, between ages 16
 and 18; and
- Not have reached their 26th birthday as of July 1st of the award year.
- Have not participated in the program for more than 5 years (whether or not consecutive).

ANNUAL DEADLINE: Ongoing - Opens on October 1st
